

<p>10.1 Implementation of actions given in Standards Guidelines for single use plastic issued earlier by the Ministry (enclosed)</p>	<p>Plastic Waste Management and Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, which is in effect from 18-3-2016 and subsequent amendment dated:27.03.2018. Under Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 the KSPCB issues consent and registration to Producer, Brand Owner, Recyclers and plastic raw material manufacturer. Plastic items like Plastic Bag, Plastic banners, Plastic bunnings, Flex, Plastic Plates, Plastic Flagg, Plastic cups, Plastic Spoons, Cling Films, Plastic sheets used for spreading on dining table, straws have been banned as per Plastic Ban notification issued on 11-03-2016 (Corrigendum 18-04-2017, 26-03-2018, 04-04-2018 & 01.10.2019) by Government of Karnataka. This was prior to issue of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016.</p> <p>a) Number of Directions issued under Section 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 to units manufacturing banned items is 104.</p> <p>b) Withdrawal of directions issued to units under Section 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 to units manufacturing for withdrawal are Changed production from banned to non banned activity/ closing of operation/ shifting of industry).</p> <p>c) Number of Proposed directions issued to the units under Section 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 for violations is 36.</p> <p>d) Court cases filed - 12.</p> <p>Officers of the Board have conducted large number of Awareness programmes throughout the state, they have participated as resource persons in the training programme arranged by other organizations. All the field staff are adequately trained. Even on 29th September, 2018 training to all the entry level officers was given. Use of cloths bags and paper bags is being encouraged.</p> <p>Board has permitted cement industries to use plastic waste for co-processing as per the guidelines notified by CPCB "Utilization of plastic waste in cement kiln". KSPCB has given permission to co-process the wastes including plastic waste in kilns of 09 cement industries in the State.
