Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Important Note: Read Faculty Transfer Rules 2020 and relevant Amendment available on DCE Web Portal without fail.

Who can apply for Transfer?

Teaching faculty **belonging to any of the categories listed in Table-1** below, **who has completed 3 years' service** in the present place of posting, can apply for Transfer.

Table-1:

Categories Eligible for Applying for Transfer (Special Categories)

- Spouse cases
- Cases of Widow or Single parent with children below 12 years or Women divorcee who has not remarried or teaching staff having physically dependent spouse and children who has suffered bench mark disability while serving in Indian Armed forces or Paramilitary forces.
- Cases of person with benchmark disabilities
- Serious ailment cases
- My name is <u>appearing in the Compulsory Transfer list</u> (Annexure to Circular No. ಕಾಶಿಇ:11: ವರ್ಗಾವಣೆ: 2021-22: ವ&ನಿ, ದಿನಾಂಕ:24.06.2021) and <u>I belong to one of the Special Categories</u> listed in Table-1.

Can I apply for Transfer?

Yes, you can. You can apply for transfer under any one of the Special Categories listed in Table-1.

My name <u>does not appear in the Compulsory Transfer list</u> and <u>I do not belong to any of the Special</u> Categories listed in Table-1.

Can apply for Transfer?

No. You cannot apply for transfer because ONLY faculty belonging to SPECIAL CATEGORIES can apply for Transfer.

My name is <u>appearing in the Compulsory Transfer list</u>. Should I apply for Transfer?

No. You need not apply for transfer unless you belong to any of the Special Categories listed in Table-1.

► I belong to TWO types of Special Categories listed in Table-1.
Can I apply for Transfer under two Special Categories?

No. You can only apply under any ONE of the Special Categories and NOT under two categories.

Who can apply for EXEMPTION from Compulsory Transfer?

Teaching faculty belonging to **any of the categories listed in Table-2** below, **whose name APPEARS in the compulsory Transfer List**, can apply for EXEMPTION from Compulsory Transfer.

Table-2:

Categories Eligible for Applying for EXEMPTION from Transfer and Periods of Exemptions.

- Teaching staff who has less than two years of service for superannuation
- Teaching staff who is undertaking a project sanctioned by the UGC, CSIR, DST and any other Government body or any statutory agency
 - Exemption for a period of two years from the date of completion of minimum length of service as prescribed in sub-rule (1) of Transfer Rules 2020 or till the completion of project.
- Teaching staff who is a research guide and has students undertaking Ph.D. or M.Phil. research work under him, in a Government First Grade College with research centre
 - Exemption for a period of two years from the date of completion of minimum length of service as prescribed in sub-rule (1) or till the completion of Ph.D. or M.Phil. whichever is earlier.
- Teaching staff who is serving as an NCC Officer
 - Exemption for a period of two years from the date of completion of minimum length of service as prescribed in sub-rule (1).
- Teaching staff who is central office bearer of Karnataka Government College Teachers Association
 - Exemption till the completion of the term of the concerned central office bearer.
- Teaching faculty **belonging to any of the categories listed in Table-1** above.
 - Exemption from Compulsory Transfer for a period of 5 years from the date of reporting to the present place of posting.
- My name does not appear in the Compulsory Transfer list. Should I apply for Exemption from Transfer?

No. Even if you belong to any of the categories in Table-2 above, you need not apply for Exemption from Transfer if your name is not listed for Compulsory Transfer.

▶ I belong to a Special Category listed in Table-1. Can apply for Exemption from Transfer?

Yes, you can. However, applicable **periods of Exemption** are as listed in Table-2.
